Newington

Report from your County Councillor for Newington

KCC has launched another round of SolarTogether which is a collective buying scheme for solar panels and battery storage open to Kent homeowners, small businesses and community owned buildings. A reverse price auction is held with prevetted installers and individual quotes then sent to those who have registered. Individuals benefit from the 'bulk buying' price and the installers have a guaranteed pipeline of work which benefits them. Over 3,000 SolarTogether installations have gone ahead in earlier rounds. There's a link for registration via the KCC website and the district councils in Kent are promoting the scheme.

Consultations are currently being held on Early Years Education in Kent (universal, targeted and specialist) and on the school term dates for the next three years. You'll find these at letstalk.kent.gov.uk and if you register to take part, you'll be alerted to future KCC consultations. There are also continuing opportunities to get involved in 'Making Space for Nature' which is creating a Local Nature Recovery Strategy for Kent and Medway. This is part of a nationwide effort to identify land that is important for biodiversity and how best to create wildlife corridors as well as reward landowners for their role in making space for nature.

KCC is currently very close to safe limits for the number of young people we have in our care. There is still only a voluntary system for transferring Unaccompanied Asylum-Seeking Children arriving in Kent to other local authorities to share the burden. The courts have ruled that the Government needs to put in place a better system, but they have also ruled that KCC must accept responsibility for the UASC that arrive in Kent and we cannot differentiate between care offered to them and our own citizen children. Eight homes are being set up around Kent to house the UASC and recruitment is taking

place for more social workers. However, as I've reported before, the numbers involved are more than any one council can reasonably accommodate.

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has declared a national incident following recent outbreaks of measles in the West Midlands and London. Measles is highly infectious and can make both children and adults seriously unwell. Two doses of the Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccine provides lifelong protection and people (whatever their age) are being urged to catch up on missed doses. The current UK vaccination rate is 83.3% - well below the 95% level that the World Health Organisation says is needed to prevent outbreaks of the disease. Information on symptoms is on the NHS website and anyone who thinks they may have measles should telephone their GP Surgery or the NHS 111.







This account brings some of those stories back to life and will perhaps bring an understanding of how Folkestone was shaped by terrible wars, widespread disease, the unforgiving sea, the new railway and fashionable society – but mostly, by the people who lived, loved, made their livelihood and finally died here.

Mostly the details are mundane, but I have been a witness in certain places and moments in time to things that I found interesting, intriguing, amusing, poignant and memorable. We must have pricked out more than three hundred marigold seedlings this week.

We were all feeling quite optimistic last week that the weather

had taken a turn for the better and it was going to get warmer.

Unfortunately that did not last too long before we were back to showers and biting cold winds again, with no respite on the horizon for at least a week!

We have the luxury of sheltering our tender plants such as the tomatoes

in a greenhouse on Pent Farm, however the growing pace has slowed down and some of them are showing signs of being too cold as there is no heating. At times the temperature has gone down to four degrees during the night. You can see from a picture below that the indigo tomatoes (a black variety) on the left, are showing their true colour, which they would not do ordinarily. Our fingers are crossed that they can survive and

perhaps pick up again soon. It makes you realise how precarious it can be growing food at times because to lose all of our tomato stock at this stage would be not quite disastrous, because we do not have to rely on the food we grow, but a real shame. There is nothing finer than home grown

tomatoes picked fresh from the plant.

Another issue with greenhouse growing is that mice have an amazing ability to be able to get inside somehow, and find the more substantial seeds such as squashes and courgettes. So it is that we shall have to sow more seeds found and eaten in this way. There is always something that wants to eat whatever you are growing. Remember this fact when buying



fruit or vegetables from the supermarket how much in the way of chemicals have gone into producing that perfect product and the cost to wildlife and the soil.

We must have pricked out more than three hundred marigold seedlings this week for both Pent Farm and Enbrook.

Used as a companion plant, they add great colour to a site and can be as tough as old boots once they get going, able to flower until the first frosts. There were also lots of zinnias and cosmos to tackle too and still plenty more that need potting on later next week. One of the pictures below shows a nasturtium plant growing merrily away at the end of one of our compost bins. The seed must have been composted but had the conditions to sprout and grow on probably because of all the rain.

What's next?


- Still jobs carried over from last week such as lemon balm removal and repotting the pot plants.
- Prick out more seedlings
- Take out the last of the celeriac
- Put some compost on a couple of beds


